FOUNDED IN 1919

Universität Hamburg was founded in 1919 as the first university in Germany to be established by a state parliament or citizen body. Nobel Prize winners such as Otto Stern, Wolfgang Pauli, Isidor Rabi, Hans Jensen, and Klaus Hasselmann worked at the University. Other well-known researchers such as Ernst Cassirer, Erwin Panofsky, Aby Warburg, William Stern, Agathe Lasch, Magdalene Schoch, Emil Artin, and Carl von Weizsäcker also worked here.

RESEARCH SERVING PEOPLE


The University Medical Center Hamburg-Eppendorf (UKE) is one of Hamburg's largest hospitals, with roughly 90,000 inpatients and another 407,000 outpatients annually. Research at the UKE focuses on 5 key areas: neurosciences, oncology, cardiovascular disease, infection/inflammation, and health care research. Further important research fields are rare congenital metabolic disorders, transplantation/stem cell therapy, and molecular skeletal biology. Campus Research provides researchers with excellent working conditions. Further research initiatives are currently underway.

MODERN, PRACTICE-ORIENTED TEACHING

The UKE provides practical and patient-oriented training to roughly 3,400 students, primarily in human medicine and dentistry. The basis is the integrated model degree program iMED Hamburg. Instruction in patient care takes place in the state-of-the-art New Clinic, while the new Medical Education Campus provides optimal learning and teaching conditions. The Medical Skills Training Center (MediTreFF), which houses models and computer-controlled simulators such as the birth simulator, provides students with the opportunity to study medicine in completely new ways.

As a University of Excellence, Universität Hamburg is the largest and most diverse research institution in northern Germany. Four clusters of excellence enjoy funding in the Excellence Strategy of the Federal and State Governments:

- CUI: Advanced Imaging of Matter (photon and nanosciences)
- Climate, Climatic Change, and Society (CLICCS) (climate research)
- Understanding Written Artefacts (manuscript cultures)
- Quantum Universe (mathematics, particle physics, astrophysics, cosmology)

The University also has many other outstanding research areas where researchers pursue cutting-edge work. These include infection research, health economics, neurosciences, and peace and security studies.
