Subject-Specific Provisions for the Master of Arts (MA) in Manuscript Cultures of the Faculty of Humanities

1 March 2023

On 27 March 2023 in accordance with Section 108 subsection 1 of the Hamburg higher education act (Hamburgisches Hochschulgesetz, HmbHG), the Executive University Board of Universität Hamburg ratified the Subject-Specific Provisions for the Master of Arts in Manuscript Cultures adopted by the Faculty of Humanities on 1 March 2023 pursuant to Section 91 subsection 2 number 1 HmbHG dated 18 July 2001 (HmbGVBI. p. 171) as amended on 17 June 2017 (HmbGVBI. p. 468).

Preamble

These Subject-Specific Provisions supplement the Examination Regulations of the Faculty of Humanities at Universität Hamburg dated 6 May 2015, as amended, which govern the master of arts degree programs and provide a description of the modules for the Master of Arts in Manuscript Cultures.

I. Supplemental provisions

Section 1

Program and examination objectives, academic degree, and implementation of the degree program

Section 1 subsection 1: Program objectives

The MA in Manuscript Cultures concentrates on central topics in the field of general manuscript research combined with subject-specific competencies. The degree program promotes the independent, analytical handling of manuscripts, the examination of the texts, images, notes, and diagrams contained therein from a cultural science perspective, the scientific analysis of manuscript materials, and the development of creative approaches to solutions that address complex cultural and scientific issues. Thematically, the degree program covers a broad spectrum of manuscript cultures, particularly in Asia, Africa, and Europe.

Section 1 subsection 3:

The academic degree, Master of Arts will be conferred.

Section 1 subsection 4:

The Faculty of Humanities is responsible for administering the degree program.

Section 4

Program and examination organization, modules, and ECTS credits Section 4 subsections 2 and 3:

- (1) Modules for the Master of Arts in Manuscript Cultures, totaling 60 ECTS credits:
- a) The following required modules must be completed:

Module MC-1 (12 ECTS credits) Manuscript Cultures in the Humanities

Module MC-2 (12 ECTS credits) Manuscript Cultures in the Natural Sciences

Module MC-MA-WB (6 ECTS credits) free elective area

MC-Thesis Module (MC-Abschluss) (30 ECTS credits)

The master's degree program will be complete upon concluding the module, MC-Thesis Module, totaling 30 ECTS credits. It includes the composition of a master's thesis (28 ECTS credits) and participation in a colloquium (2 ECTS credits).

(2) In the free elective area (6 ECTS credits), students will have the opportunity to select elective courses from the degree program as well as *Studium Generale* courses according to their own interest. The elective area thus serves to reinforce interdisciplinary expertise, and enables students to strengthen their interdisciplinary skills, allowing them to gain knowledge in other subject areas, and to think outside the boundaries of their specialization. Students have the option of choosing introductory language and/or subject-specific courses in order to acquire the required methodological knowledge to pursue a specialization or greater knowledge of an individual topic.

Section 14 Master's thesis

Section 14 subsection 2 sentence 1:

In order to be allowed to commence work on the master's thesis at least one of the modules, MC-1 or MC-2, must have been successfully completed.

Section 14 subsection 7 sentence 1:

Students have five months in which to complete their master's thesis and it will be worth 28 ECTS credits in the program.

Section 15 Evaluation of examinations

Section 15 subsection 3 sentence 9:

The module examinations contribute to the overall final grade for the master's degree as follows: 30 percent for MC-1, 30 percent for MC-2, and 70 percent for the final module. The modules and courses from the elective area will be graded as pass or fail and are not included in the overall final grade.
